Disability Questions

- 1. Do you have any physical or mental health conditions or illnesses lasting or expected to last 12 months or more?
- 2. Does this/Do any of these condition(s) or illness(es) affect you in any of the following areas?
 - a. Vision (for example blindness or partial sight)
 - b. Hearing (for example deafness or partial hearing)
 - c. Mobility (for example walking short distances or climbing stairs)
 - d. Dexterity (for example lifting and carrying objects, using a keyboard)
 - e. Learning or understanding or concentrating
 - f. Memory
 - g. Mental health
 - h. Stamina or breathing or fatigue
 - i. Socially or behaviourally (for example associated with autism, attention deficit disorder or Asperger's Syndrome)
 - i. Other
- 3. Does this/Do any of these condition(s) or illness(es) reduce your ability to carry out day-to-day activities? Would you say... (a lot, a little, not at all)

Note: Respondents were allowed to select as many categories as necessary in response to Q2.

Sex

Information on sex was collected at early Waves in MCS. This was recoded into a binary variable (male/female) No data were missing for Wave 7 respondents for whom valid disability and self-harm data were available.

Ethnicity

Detailed information on ethnicity was collected at multiple Waves in MCS. Given the very small numbers in some cells, this was recoded into a binary variable (ethic minority), with 'white' coded as 0 and all other response options coded as 1. No data were missing for Wave 7 respondents for whom valid disability and self-harm data were available.

Sexual Orientation

Sexual orientation was primarily derived from responses to the following question.

- Which of the following options best describes how you currently think of yourself?
 - o Completely heterosexual / straight
 - Mainly heterosexual / straight
 - Bisexual
 - o Mainly gay or lesbian
 - Completely gay or lesbian
 - o Other

Given the very small numbers in some cells, this was recoded into a binary variable (sexual minority) with 'completely heterosexual / straight' coded as 0 and all other response options coded as 1.

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For 10 participants these data were missing, but they did respond to a question on sexual attraction.

- I have felt sexually attracted...
 - Only to opposite sex
 - More often to opposite sex and at least once to same sex
 - About equally often to opposite sex and at least once to same sex
 - More often to same sex and at least once to opposite sex
 - Only ever to same sex
 - o I have never felt sexually attracted to anyone at all

For the participants with missing data sexual minority was coded as 0 for the response 'only to opposite sex' and coded as 1 for all other response options. Data were missing for 0.2% of Wave 7 respondents for whom valid disability and self-harm data were available.

Family Poverty

Family income poverty was assessed at Waves 1-4 of MCS (cohort member ages 9 months, 3 years, 5 years and 7 years). In line with UK government approach to defining income poverty, poverty was defined as having a combined household equivalized income (before housing costs) of less than 60% of the weighted sample median. The modified OECD equivalization scale was used to adjust income considering household composition. Data from all available Waves were combined to create a binary variable: not exposed to income poverty in any Wave vs. exposed to income poverty in one or more Waves). Data were missing for <0.1% of Wave 7 respondents for whom valid disability and self-harm data were available.

Bullied at Ages 7, 11 or 14

Self-report data on exposure to bullying was collected from the children/adolescents at ages 7 (Wave 4), 11 (Wave 5) and 14 (Wave 6) years. From these we created a binary variable (never bullied vs. bullied at one or more Wave). Data were missing for 0.2% of Wave 7 respondents for whom valid disability and self-harm data were available.

Depression at age 14

Short-Form Mood and Feelings Questionnaire, a 13-item questionnaire designed to screen for depression in children and adolescents, was administered at age 14.(1) Two studies have suggested using a cut-off of eight or higher for major depression.(1, 2) Data were missing for 3.1% of Wave 7 respondents for whom valid disability and self-harm data were available.
